- 2. Ernie's gopher did not finish in 3rd place, he was not Winky or Blinky, and Moe in the red collar was the only gopher that scored higher than him.
- **3.** Eddie's gopher finished in front of Minky, and Moe did not sing.
- **4.** Elwood's gopher did not wear a blue collar, and he did not juggle or yodel.
- **5.** Winky, the juggling gopher in the pink collar, finished in 5th place.
- 6. Ellen's gopher did not finish last.

- **4.** The 4th graders ate twice as many hot dogs as the 8th graders, and the 5th graders ate half as many hot dogs as the 6th graders who won the pie-eating contest.
- Alice was not surprised at the contest her students won because she noticed that they all were naturals with a beanbag.
- 6. A 5th grader had a nosebleed, a 4th grader was sunburned, Anthony's favorite student nearly drowned, and no 6th grader wore glasses.
